Kingsood Reading Challenge

Dear Parents/Carers,

As part of our continued commitment to instilling a 'love of reading' within our children at Kingswood, we have developed a 100 book reading challenge. We hope this will encourage children to continue to widen their home reading experiences and enjoy books they may not have considered before.

The books have been split into year group pairs with lists of recommended reads provided for children in KS1, Years 3 and 4 and Years 5 and 6. Every child will be given a list and these will also be available on our website.

The books are listed in three columns with the texts becoming slightly more challenging as you move to the third column. These lists reflect a survey undertaken by the TES and the National Association for the Teaching of English to find teachers' top fiction books.

Each book is worth a total of 10 points. To achieve these points, children need to:

- 1) Read one of the books from their 100 book list
- 2) Complete a reading review (these can be found in their classroom)
- 3) Highlight/tick the book off on their list
- 4) Ask an adult in their class to sign their sheet to confirm the review has been received
- 5) File the review in the reading review folder for others to read
- 6) Choose another book and repeat

To encourage participation, children will receive certificates in achievement assembly once they reach a certain number of points:

KS1

30 points = Bronze

70 points = Silver

100 points = Gold

150 points = Platinum

300 points = Diamond

KS2

50 points = Bronze

100 points = Silver

150 points = Gold

250 points = Platinum

500 points = Diamond

Book tokens will be available once children reach 'Gold' status.

Many of the books listed can be found in class reading corners. However, we would really appreciate any donations of books from the lists – this will help us ensure all books are available in school. If the book is not available in school, please encourage your children to visit their local library to seek them out.
